





GENERAL OVERVIEW

The Week for Sustainable Mobility and Climate #SMDC2022, organised by the CODATU Association, CETUD, and the Climate Chance Association, from 3rd to 7th October 2022 in Dakar, from the 3rd to 7th October 2022 at the King Fahd Palace Hotel, will bring together the entire community of African mobility and climate actors.

During **5** days, the event will bring together **1,500** high-level personalities, recognised climate and mobility experts, as well as local and regional representatives, entrepreneurs, NGOs, researchers and citizens, who will share keynotes and contribute to round tables and interactive workshops.

Proposals will be presented by adopting the **"Dakar Declaration"**, a high-level contribution to the COP27 taking place a few weeks later in Sharm el-Sheikh.

The Week for Sustainable Mobility and Climate 2022 is part of the international climate agenda as a "Pre-COP for African actors".

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE #SMDC2022

The #SMDC2022 will include the **3** following major events: the CODATU XVIII Conference (excluding the scientific conference which has already taken place in November 2021), the 2nd Territorial Assistes of Urban Mobility, and the 4th Climate Chance Summit Africa #SCCA2022 over 3 days, from the 4th to 6th October 2022.

CODATU XVIII Conference

International reference conference on sustainable urban mobility, bringing together academics, researchers, experts, local authorities, transport professionals, and civil society to discuss ongoing challenges and future opportunities, and to exchange experiences in order to support international cooperation.

CETUD 2nd Territorial Assises of Urban Mobility

National and regional conference, co-organised with the Association of Mayors of Senegal (AMS), with the technical and financial partners of the State of Senegal, with the aim of dealing with the current and future challenges of sustainable urban mobility. It is a special moment of exchange to draw up an overview of the reforms and projects, but also to set out the perspectives in the context of accelerated development of African cities, in order to promote green, inclusive and climate change resilient urban transport systems.

4th Climate Chance Summit Africa

A unique annual meeting for climate action on the continent, bringing together African non-state actors and local governments, raising their actions, messages and projects to the front of the international climate scene through a vast call for contributions campaign feeding the Climate Chance Cartography for Action, which is an essential step in the progress of the roadmaps and concrete actions led by the African sectoral coalitions.



Other highlights of the Week

Network in sustainable urban mobility of the AUF

The Network in sustainable urban mobility, created within the AUF, organizes on 1st and 2nd October at the University of Dakar its first summer university for Ph.D. students. The objective is to organize debates between supervisors and doctoral students, then to give them methodological advice and to build a follow-up of their work. On 3 October, the French-speaking higher education and research institutions will hold their first in-person plenary meeting to present the Network, its roadmap (training and research map, coordination of doctoral schools and summer universities, MOOCs, etc.) and its development.

A CoM SSA day

On October 4, the Covenant of Mayors in Sub-Saharan Africa (CoM SSA) initiative is holding a one-day event that highlights the most pressing issues related to climate change and access to climate finance at the local level in the Sub-Saharan region.

The event focuses on a variety of topics related to climate action plans and unlocking climate finance for sustainable infrastructure, climate change adaptation and energy access. The more than 230 CoM SSA mayors and partners will share their experiences and success stories, focusing on how to overcome the challenges local governments face.

The Great Green Wall and Biodiversity Day

On 6 October, several events: workshops and plenary sessions, will focus on the issues of biodiversity and the Great Green Wall.

Many networks at the event

Many networks and initiatives will be associated with the Dakar event: the Covenant of Mayors in Sub-Saharan Africa (CoMSSA) organising its annual conference, the MobiliseYourCity community of practice, the North/South Mobility Organising Authorities Club, the network of Francophone higher education and research establishments with the support of the AUF (Francophonie University Agency), Movin'On LAB Africa (African Mobility Observatory), etc.



An opportunity to share best practices from the field

The SMDC will also be an opportunity to showcase best practices in climate and biodiversity action on the African continent, collected through a call for contributions. The contributions campaign, launched in advance of the event and widely shared throughout the networks of non-state actors, will focus on different areas of expertise and strategic sectors: access to climate finance, mobility & transport, urban planning, institutional and operational governance, renewable energies, building & construction, urban development, adaptation & water, agriculture, food & reforestation, education & training, and circular economy.

PROGRAMME OF THE WEEK

The exclusive programme of the #SMDC2022 will bring together **300** speakers in **70** keynotes, interactive workshops and round tables bringing together the climate community in all its diversity, high-level personalities, experts and field actors. It will offer exchanges on the challenges of mitigation and adaptation to climate change, high-level plenary sessions, and the sharing of best practices in climate action.

Different formats are proposed:

High-level plenary sessions

4 October: joint opening plenary of the three partners with the Senegalese authorities, in the presence of the Presidents of Climate Chance and CODATU; joint plenary "Mobility and climate: sustainable and fair urban solutions in Africa, heading towards COP27 in Egypt".
5 October: joint CODATU, Climate Chance and CETUD plenary "Energy transitions, climate and urban mobility".
6 October: joint plenary for the presentation and adoption of the "Dakar Declaration" with the Senegalese Presidency.

Parallel multi-thematic working sessions organised by CODATU and "Serious Games" workshops organised by the E+ City.

Workshops of Climate Chance's African sectoral coalitions, reinforced by a call for contributions, to work on the progress, achievements and development of the African coalitions' activities. Some workshops may be joint between CODATU and Climate Chance depending on the themes.

"Focus" sessions to follow up and establish a progress report on important Mobility and Climate initiatives in Africa and Senegal.

A "Pitch Corner" allowing some participants who responded to the call for contributions to present their initiatives.

"Side events", dedicated to partners wishing to converge on the event for their annual meetings or conferences (African Ministers of Transport Conference, Covenant of Mayors for Sub-Saharan Africa, etc.).

"Moments of conviviality" and networking, B2B meetings in the lounges provided, stands to discover the players in the mobility and climate sectors, etc.
