Senegal risk profile

Senegal is vulnerable to a multitude of climate change and man-induced disasters including flooding, high sea levels (Dakar, St Louis, Casamance regions), drought, desertification (Matam region) land degradation, deforestation (Ziguinchor/Sedhiou regions).

Flooding in particular is a major concern in the country and with a long coastline, it is the most serious natural hazard the country faces. Urban areas in and around the capital Dakar and other major cities are most at risk. Desertification and the resultant droughts have ravage a lot of the sahel parts in the north.

Project Objectives

- 1. Reinforce the capacity of the vulnerable community members to manage disaster risks through developing their own action plans at a community wide level.
- 2. The inclusion of, and systematic collaboration between governments, vulnerable people, CSOs and community leaders in the design and implementation of climate change mitigation plans that will benefit the community.
- 3. Establish a local baseline and monitoring process to measure progress towards achieving an inclusive, 'people-centered' approach to resilience-building, as promoted within national guidelines and international frameworks.

Project Outcomes:

- 03 community consultation workshops in Bokki to help develop local actions plans.
- 300 families (2000 people) received COVID-19 prevention education and sensitization as well as support for basic daily needs in Rufisque.
- 3. 200 men supported with resources to build barriers against climate extremes in the sahel.
- 4. 50 women received skills training support for income generating activities in Thiaroye.
- 5. Tree planting campaigns organised to fight deforestation in Kolda
